

What about bottom exhibit tabs?

Change in Procedure:

No Exhibit Tabs in Sacramento

Sacramento County Superior Court no longer requires exhibits in one copy to be separated by bottom tab.

Exhibits in **all copies** should be separated by a blank piece of regular pleading paper with their exhibit letter or number (for instance, "Exhibit A") typed or written on the bottom of the page.

Exhibit A



Exhibit tabs are no longer required in Sacramento County filings. Previously, the court required bottom tabs to separate the exhibits in one copy of each filed motion, as set out in Cal. Rule of Court 3.1100. Now that electronic filing is available, this is impractical. Even if you are filing a paper copy, the Civil Department of the Sacramento Superior Court no longer wants the exhibit tabs to be included.

If you need them for a different court, you can purchase sets from [Avery Products](https://www.avery.com/products/dividers/11376) (<https://www.avery.com/products/dividers/11376>) and sometimes other business supply stores or specialty legal supply stores. You can either use pre-printed letter tabs, or buy blank tabs and write in the letters.
